Referring Municipality:

- 1. Borough of Stonington:** Proposed revisions to the Borough's Zoning Regulations regarding Map regarding a change from R-1 to RP.

Finding: Based on a review of the information submitted, it was determined that the proposed map change would not have any adverse inter-municipal impact.

- 2. City of New London :** Proposed revisions to the City's Zoning Regulations to create the Coit Street West Historic Overlay District.

Finding: Based on a review of the information submitted, it was determined that the proposed text amendments would not have any adverse inter-municipal impact.

- 3. City of New London :** Proposed revisions to the City's Zoning Map to create the Coit Street West Historic Overlay District.

Finding: Based on a review of the information submitted, it was determined that the proposed map amendments would not have any adverse inter-municipal impact.

- 4. Town of Colchester:** Proposed update to the Town's Plan of Conservation and Development.

Finding: Based on a review of the material submitted, SCCOG staff concluded that the Town's proposed updates to their Plan of Conservation and Development appear to be in general conformance with the Regional Plan of Conservation and Development 2007, and the State Conservation and Development Policies Plan 2013-2018.

- 5. Town of East Haddam:** Proposed revisions to the Town's Zoning Regulations regarding Mobil Food Units and roof top mounted solar panels.

Finding: Based on a review of the information submitted, it was determined that the proposed text amendments would not have any adverse inter-municipal impact.

- 6. Town of Scotland:** Proposed revisions to the Town's Zoning Regulations regarding agriculture and equestrian uses.

Finding: Based on a review of the information submitted, it was determined that the proposed text amendments would not have any adverse inter-municipal impact.

- 7. Town of East Lyme:** Proposed update to the Town's Plan of Conservation and Development.

Finding: This document is still under review. The Town has scheduled a May 21, 2015 public hearing.
