- 1. Call to Order and Introductions: John Filchak, Executive Director for NECCOG welcomed the participants to the meeting and each participant to introduce themselves and who they were representing.
- 2. Purpose of Working Group and Statewide Recovery Framework: Mike Caplet, CT DESPP/ DEMHS - Mr. Caplet overviewed the State and Regional recovery framework. A copy of his presentation is attached to the minutes.
- 3. Discussion of Issues Related to Long-Term Recovery from the COVID-19 Pandemic for Economic/Natural & Cultural Resources: John Filchak, NECCOG. Before opening up for discussion, Mr. Filchak went through a slideshow (attached) showing the results of a survey of those invited to the meeting as a means to begin discussions.

Comments made included:

- The need to have one-on-one technical support for business owners and individuals to help with applications, grants, etc.
- Long wait times and confusion at the state level.
- Language barriers
- The need for increased consistency around language and opportunities for nonprofits, which are historically not part of SBA's clients which are not treated as "businesses" resulting in confusion and complications on forms as many portions did not fit.
- Outdoor venues (beaches, trails, etc.) are seeing significant increases in use without the proper level of maintenance or investment
- Many organizations that do not have paid staff, but own the facilities, are not eligible/limited for any funding.
- Funding assistance need may be overblown
