About the Position

Regional Planners participate in comprehensive planning activities and functions, assist with the administration of SCCOG's transportation planning program, and provide assistance to member municipalities with land use planning and administration and special projects as needed. SCCOG staff have the opportunity to engage in multiple subject areas including land use regulation, economic development, natural resource conservation, transportation, housing, human services, sustainability and resilience, renewable energy, and emergency management.

Qualifications

The position of Planner I requires a bachelor's degree in planning or related field; Planner II requires a master's degree in planning or related field and 1 year of experience, or a bachelor's degree and 3 years of experience; Planner III requires a master's degree and 4 years of experience, or a bachelor's degree and 6 years of experience. Applicants with demonstrated experience in municipal land use administration, transportation planning, and grants management are encouraged to apply. The successful candidate will have excellent communication skills and experience with project management, analyzing and presenting data and preparing technical written reports.
